It has been a smooth start to the school year and it has certainly been a busy one. Our new Building the Education Revolution early childhood centre now has all of its interactive white boards installed and with training in their use being run at our school in early March children will soon be reaping the benefits they provide to support and enhance learning.

Our kindergarten staff report that there are significant numbers of mosquitoes about at the moment. We have contacted the City of Bayswater and they are addressing the problem by baiting and trapping in a number of areas.

Our School Board met on Wednesday 16 February. Ms Sandra Catlin was appointed as Chairperson and Ms Kim Ould as Deputy Chair. Please accept a big thank you to you both for taking on these very important roles. At its first meeting the board examined the Workforce Plan for 2010-2013. We will shortly offer an opportunity for our school community to participate in a workshop to inform the development of our Business Plan. I urge you to try to make time to come along and add your thoughts to the future directions of your school.

It has been great to see all of our students in uniform. Our uniform shop is open on Tuesday mornings and Thursday afternoons. Should you require financial assistance to purchase uniforms please contact our Deputy Principal Mrs Rosemary Johnson.

The playground equipment nearest to the Senior Learning Community building is designed for use with students who are in Year 3 and above. Students from other years are not permitted to play on this equipment during school hours. Should you choose to allow your children to do so under your supervision after hours, it is *at your own risk*.

Many parents have requested the opportunity to be better informed about where the school is at and what will happen in their child/children's class in 2011. In response, a parent information evening will be held on **Monday February 28** between **6:30pm** and **7:30pm** (for **Years 1 to 3**) and **Tuesday March 1** between **6:30pm** and **7:30pm** (for **Years 4 to 7**).

This is a parent/caregiver evening and children are not required to attend.

Please be reminded that we are unable to guarantee adequate supervision of students before 8:30 am. Any student with or without their parent should sit in the courtyard or undercover area until they are released at 8:30am when students should prepare themselves for the school day. A number of students have been dropped at school at around 7:30am and this places those students at risk.




