

AFL Multicultural Day



2017 Kindergarten enrolments cut off- Friday, 22 July 2016.

2017 Kindergarten enrolments cut off- Friday, 22 July 2016.

Our community is reminded that Kindy and Pre Primary enrolments for 2017 close on Friday, 22 July (End of Week One). Please Note: Students who are currently enrolled in the school's Pre Primary programme will be automatically enrolled in our Year 1 programme commencing in 2017.

As Pre Primary is now the first compulsory year at school, all current Kindergarten children who reside within our local-intake area will have a guaranteed Pre Primary place for 2017. However, in order to secure a place, parents/caregivers will need to come up to the office and sight the original enrolment application used to enrol your child(ren) in Kindergarten, note any changes (if any), and then initial and date the documents. By completing this process, parents/caregivers will be able to secure a place for Pre Primary in 2017 and the school will be able to plan classes accordingly. A separate letter will be sent home to our current Kindergarten parents/caregivers early next term to indicate when to come into the school office and complete the Pre Primary enrolment process for 2017.

Unfortunately, parents/caregivers of children currently enrolled in kindergarten who live outside the school's local-intake area will be required to apply for Pre Primary in 2017 by Friday, 22 July. It is at this stage that all applications are assessed against the Department of Education's Enrolment policy. The policy assigns a particular priority order by which all applications are assessed before a place is offered to any child.

The following documentation must be provided when you come in to complete a formal enrolment form for a new student:

- Proof of residence to be lodged with your application (current utilities account or a rental agreement longer than three months).
- Your child's birth certificate/passport/visa, child's up to date immunisation records and child's medical information (asthma,

allergies etc.)

Please see Mrs Millar or Mrs Tippett in the school office if you require any further clarification.

Collection of Recess and Lunch Items

Most orders are placed in the class basket and returned to the classroom; but recess orders, fish & chips, spuds, soup, hot chocolate, icy-poles and ice-creams must be collected from the canteen. Please remind your child that it is their responsibility to collect these items on the day they are ordered.

The canteen is not financially responsible for items not collected. Due to food spoilage and the impossibility of keeping records, these items cannot be supplied on another day.
