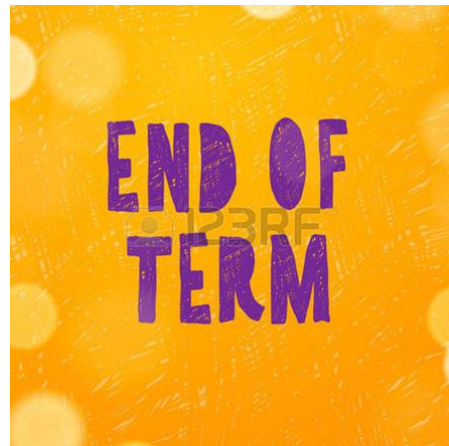

As many parents/caregivers would know, Pre-primary is the first compulsory year at school. However, in order to secure a place, parents/caregivers of children currently in Kindy are reminded to come into the office and sight the original enrolment application used to enrol your child(ren), note any changes (if any), and then initial and date the documents. By completing this process, parents/caregivers will be able to secure a place for Pre-primary in 2018 and the school will be able to plan classes accordingly.

I would also like to remind parents/caregivers that if you have a child who will be due to start Kindergarten in 2018, to come up to the office and complete the necessary documentation before the close of applications on Friday, 21 July. Please feel free to speak with Mrs Tippett in the office if you require further clarification.

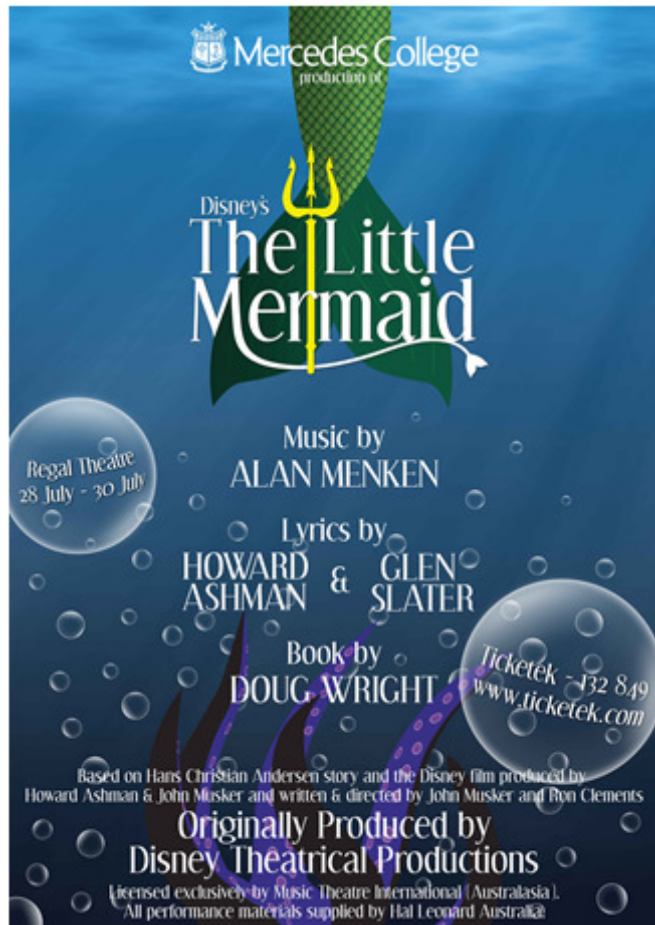
