### Message from the Principal

#### Before and After School Play

With the addition of our new junior primary playground, it may be pertinent to remind all parents/caregivers about the requirement of keeping a watchful eye on your children during the after school play that takes place for that 20min period at the end of the school day.



It is imperative that parents/caregivers closely supervise their child (ren's) play to prevent any mischief or potentially dangerous play taking place. Simply being on school premises does not qualify as supervision. Only having eyes on your child(ren) does. Furthermore, there is an expectation that when the siren sounds to signify the end of the after school play, that everyone moves promptly off school site.

I would also like to remind parents/caregivers that children who arrive at school in the morning are not permitted to play on the basketball courts on Gibbney Reserve unless they are being supervised by a parent/caregiver who takes on the responsibility of supervising their play.

## School Board Report



As students and parents recover from our annual Maylands Peninsula PS faction athletics carnival today, it gives me great pleasure to update you on board matters.

At our Term 3 meeting on Monday, your Board again discussed a wide variety of matters. As I have mentioned previously, the Board's role primarily is to provide advice and support to the MPPS Leadership Team as well as raise matters and ideas that we believe are of importance to the School. For the Board to be effective we require a good and open relationship with the School's Leadership Team, and I am delighted that this is the case.

There are a few matters that are currently occupying the Board's time. The overarching one is to further develop our relationship and engagement with the MPPS community. Encouraging interest in and attendance at board meetings is something we are working towards, along with ensuring a great understanding of the role your Board plays within the MPPS community.

I am delighted that one of the Board's ideas, an Honour Board to recognise MPPS councillors and leadership and academic prize winners, is being created. Thanks to the funding support of the P&C, the Honour Board should be unveiled in Term 4.

Another matter that was discussed was an update by Mr Andrijich on changes to the way the Education Department funds schools like MPPS. This latest change relates to the funding allocation under the English as an Additional Language or Dialect (EAL/D) system. In 2020, The Department will be introducing English proficiency measures to determine how much money a school should receive for its EAL/D students. Furthermore, Pre-primary students who receive EAL/D funding next year will only be funded at 50% of the Year 1-6 student rate.

While it is great to note the strong English language performance of our students who in the past have been eligible for EAL/D funding, this good result unfortunately means MPPS will from next year receive significantly less funding from the Department. The challenge for the School's Leadership Team will be to find savings elsewhere, without affecting the classrooms, to offset this looming funding cut. The Board has encouraged the School to let the Education Department know of the negative impact the EAL/D restructure has on MPPS. We also have full confidence that Mr Andrijich and his Leadership Team will come up with an acceptable solution.

Your Board comprises parents and caregivers, community members and MPPS teachers. I am one of the parents on the Board and my three-year term expires at the end of this year. I intend to offer myself up for re-election and Mr Andrijich will early next term outline the

Last Thursday, students received a Kapture Photography order envelope. The recommended method of ordering your photos is online through Kapture's website as your payment is secure and can be easily verified at any time. Alternatively, you can pay by cash and return the provided envelope to the school on the photography day. If you place your order online, please DO NOT return your envelope to school.

Kindy and Pre-primary classes are having their photos on Monday, 16 and Tuesday, 17 September. Year 1 to 6 classes are having their photos on Wednesday, 18 and Thursday, 19 September. The photo schedule is printed on the back of the school photos letter attached to the Kapture envelope.

## Recycling Station changes

Thank you to everyone who has been bringing in items for our recycling station. It is great to see so many people getting involved and doing their bit to help our environment.

**Unfortunately, Terracycle has cancelled the Beauty Products and Mailing Satchel programs, so please do not bring any more of these items to the Recycling Station.**

Plastic mailing satchels can be recycled through the Redcycle soft plastic bins located at Coles and Woolworths stores. This includes any plastic envelopes that are internally padded with bubble wrap. However, any padded envelopes that have a paper or cardboard exterior will need to be placed in your residential red lid general waste bin.



Some plastic beauty product bottles that can be easily cleaned out can have the bottle placed in your residential yellow lid recycling bin, however all lids (including pump and spray tops) and unfortunately many of the other beauty product packaging items will need to be placed in your residential red lid general waste bin.

We are currently looking into introducing some new recycling schemes with more details to come in the near future. In the meantime, please continue to bring in your used batteries, pens/markers/textas, dish and air care products, printer cartridges and oral care products.

**Also, please ensure that laundry and general cleaning products are not included in the dish and air care products recycling bin as these are not covered by the recycling program. Please refer to the photo below which gives some examples of some items that**

were received in the bins and which bins you should place them in at home.
