Commencement of 2020 School Year

Change of LOTE in 2020

As a consequence of Madame Marshall retiring, the Leadership Team have made the decision to move our language over from French to Italian. The decision to go with Italian was largely due to the fact that we now have the opportunity to bring our language programme into alignment with our two main destination high schools- Mount Lawley Senior High School and John Forrest Secondary College. The two languages in common between these two secondary schools are Japanese and Italian. However, due to the fact that John Forrest Secondary College have experienced difficulty in recent times in maintaining the integrity of an Italian language programme in the school, due to the fact that a number of schools moved away from offering a language when it became optional five or so years ago, the decision was made to move over to Italian.

However, after much investigation and deliberation, the decision was made by the Helping Hands hierarchy in the eastern states to close the service due to the risks associated with transitioning the students to/from the school site, as too the fact that 'third party' bus providers could not guarantee consistency of service.

I would encourage parents/caregivers affected by this decision to make contact with Maylands Out of School Care at Richard Street on 9272 7732 or the YMCA Out of School Care service at Maylands Park on 9271 4146 to discuss the possibility of securing a place for your child(ren).
